1 Eucharistic Prayers

Exposition (when the celebrant is bringing the Eucharist to the Altar)

Hymn:

O salutaris Hostia Quae caeli pandis ostium; Bella premunt hostilia, Da robur, fer auxillium.

Uni trinoque Domino Sit sempiterna gloria, Qui vitam sine termino Nobis donet in patria. Amen. **Benediction** (when the celebrant goes to the altar, genuflects, and kneels after some time of Adoration)

Hymn:

Tantum ergo Sacramentum Veneremur cernui, Et antiquum documentum Novo cedat ritui; Praestet fides supplementum Sensuum defectfui.

Genitori Gentioque

Laus et jubilatio, Salus, honor, virtus quoque Sit et benedictio; Procedenti ab utroque Compar sit laudatio. Amen.

Priest/Deacon: You have given them Bread from heaven

ALL: Having all sweetness within it

Priest/Deacon: Lord Jesus Christ, you gave us the Eucharist as the memorial of your suffering and death. May our worship of this sacrament of your body and blood, help us to experience the salvation won for us and the peace of the kingdom, where you live with the Father and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever.

ALL: Amen.

(The celebrant will then bless all present with the Eucharist.)

The Divine Praises:

Blessed be God. Blessed be his holy name. Blessed be Jesus Christ, true God and true man. Blessed be the name of Jesus. Blessed be his most Sacred Heart. Blessed be his most Precious Blood. Blessed be Jesus in the most holy sacrament of the altar. Blessed be the Holy Spirit, the Paraclete. Blessed be the great Mother of God, Mary most holy. Blessed be her holy and Immaculate Conception.

Blessed be her glorious

Blessed be the name of Mary,
virgin and Mother.
Blessed be St. Joseph, her most
chaste spouse.

What is Adoration?

In the Catechism of the Catholic Church we are told that "Adoration is the first attitude of man acknowledging that he is a creature before

his Creator. It exalts the greatness of the Lord who made us and the almighty power of the Savior who sets us free from evil. Adoration is homage of the spirit to the "King of Glory," respectful silence in the presence of the "ever greater" God. Adoration of the thrice-holy and sovereign God of love blends with humility and gives assurance to our supplications." (CCC 2628)

"We can show our adoration to God in many ways, but in Eucharistic Adoration, we spend time adoring the true presence of Christ in the Eucharist ... You really don't have

to "do" anything ... You can just sit there and look at Jesus. Take the time to be with Him ... This is your personal time with Christ." (CatholicLink, How to go to Adoration)



Why do I need the Sacrament of Reconciliation/ Confession?

"The Sacraments

"When the priest offers the bread and wine during the Liturgy of the Eucharist, something called transubstantiation takes place — the bread and wince become the actual Body and Blood of Jesus Christ. Though they look like normal bread and wine, Christ is in fact present in every morsel of bread and every drop of wine.

But sometimes the appearance of the bread and wine change, too. Christ's true presence has been revealed over the centuries through several Eucharistic miracles." (Denver Catholic, "Eucharistic miracles reveal Christ's real presence")
