The OMY Professional Development Track (The Track)

The Track: STOP 1 > Ministry 101: Minister with Youth Orientation

> What is Ministry 101?

A yearly, in-person training on basic practical skills in Ministry with Youth to help new Ministers establish healthy habits crucial to effectively engaging in the mission of ministering with young people. It becomes the foundation for their participation in Stop 2, Minister Cohorts.

> What topics are covered in Ministry 101?

Topics include the Vocation and Role of a Minister, Establishing Vision and Goals, Teams and Partnerships, Professionalism, and Basic Management Skills.

> Who can attend Ministry 101?

New Ministers with Youth with 3 years or less in their ministry role. We also welcome D/CREs, Confirmation Catechists, and Scout and CYO leaders, pastors, parochial vicars, and deacons.

> How much does it cost to register?

The cost is **under \$40 per registrant**.

> When and Where is the next Ministry 101

Once a year at a pre-determined location | 9am to 4:30pm (typically)

The Track: STOP 2 > Minister Cohorts

> What is a Cohort?

It is a one-year, one-hour-a-month on Zoom training on the 6 essential elements of Ministry with Youth.

> What are the 6 Essential Elements covered?

(1) Working with What you Have, (2) Building a Dynamic Team of Volunteers, (3) Loving Parents and Working with Them, (4) Developing More Than Free Labor, (5) Models of Ministry, (6) Implementing Intentional Discipleship

> Who can participate in a Cohort?

All lay Ministers who complete Ministry 101 or have over 3 years experience in the field.

> How much does it cost to participate?

The cost is **under \$100** to participate. It includes MCODE assessment, in-person mid-year retreat, 1 on 1 coaching session, and all materials.

The Track: STOP 3 > Certificate in Youth Ministry Studies

> What is the Certificate in Youth Ministry Studies?

Through contact instruction, Ministers can expect to build a community of support and be equipped with the essential knowledge of ministry, spirituality, and practical skills needed to minister to teens today.

> What are the courses in the certification program?

Person of the Youth Minister, Context of Youth Ministry, Youth Ministry Management, Parish Infrastructure, Forming Missionary Disciples, Prayer & Worship, Forming Catholic Identity, and Pastoral Care.

> Who should register for certification?

All Ministers who have been in Ministry for at least 3 years.

> When will the Certificate program begin?

In 2026/2027. There is a minimum of 8 students required for each course.

> How much does the certification cost?

The cost may range between mid \$300's and mid \$400s per student per course (8 courses total). Fee includes each course book and food.



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Professional Development "Beyond" The Track

> Professional Development Gatherings

Gatherings on topics relevant to Ministry with Youth, Minister care, and current youth culture and trends.

> Topics are presented by experts in the respective fields.

> Continuing the Journey Conference

A bi-annual weekend conference for youth workers by the Archdiocese of Newark.

- > Held every two years in April. The next one is in 2026.
- > Fee has traditionally been under \$300 with on-site accommodations, less if staying off-site. Includes meals.

A FREE 7 session formation opportunity to equip pastors with a better understanding of the discipleship emphases required for reaching the young.

> Pastors identify challenges and outline strategies for parish growth and leadership, set future goals, and design ongoing partnerships.

> Zoom Gatherings
